Chairman's Report

It is my pleasure to present this, my first Annual report as chairman of Taranaki Racing Inc.

Our AGM is being held late this year to facilitate our Auditors reporting under new parameters.

We are 3 months in to the new season and some of the matters that I refer to in this report pertain to that period. I am happy to report that the Club made a sound profit before depreciation in what was a difficult year for our industry.

Your Board and CEO have worked hard to maintain a sensible yet innovative approach to managing our financial and industrial interests.

It is well recognised by the NZ Racing board and NZTR that there needs to be a change in direction and more money is required for stakes. Hopefully some of the ideas being touted by the racing board and NZTR will result in a better outlook.

New legislation is set to go through Parliament that promises to open up new opportunities in the area of returns from wagering on Racing in New Zealand.

As you are aware we held a Special Meeting at which we changed our name to Taranaki Racing Incorporated, and adopted a new constitution based on a generic model that was produced by NZTR and as a result we no longer have a ward system. Election of members to the Board will be voted on by all TRI members and we will continue to have at least one Harness member on the Board.

We have lost 3 Board members with the resignations of John Gray and Allan Roberts who have both left the area, and the sad passing of Gail Drought. Our sincere condolences go to Gail's family and we will miss her contribution to the Club and Racing in general.

We wish John and Allan the very best in the future and I am sure that we will see them back from time to time.

All three of these members were on our board from its inauguration and have given outstanding service, John's dedication and contribution as Chairman in particular was much appreciated.

It was very special at the Special meeting to bestow Life Membership on Ivan Hobbs and John Wheeler who have both given sterling service to the Club over many years and are a source of sage knowledge and advice about all things racing. Congratulations to you both.

Our Race meetings during the season have been well supported and continually receive accolades from people who come here as participants in the industry on the way we do things.

This situation reflects the hard work that is put in by many people including our Staff, Stewards, Clerks of the Course, Caterers and everyone who is involved in the work that goes in to producing a Race day event.

We are fortunate to have the support of great sponsors and I wish to acknowledge the massive part that you play in our operation.

The Platinum Homes Taranaki Cup was won by "Girl of my Dreams" trained by Nigel Tiley and the Phoenix Park 2YO Classic was won by Caorunn trained by Trent Busuttin.

The Powerworx Opunake Cup was won by Longchamp trained by Andrew Campbell.

A strong running of the Bob Sharrock Memorial Oaks Prelude has seen it elevated to listed status.

Congratulations go to our local trainers for their successes during the season. In particular Kawi (Allan Sharrock) and Pentathlon (John Wheeler) performed at the highest level and look set to go on to greater things.

In line with our Strategic Plan, we have started construction of the 4th wing of the stable block and have undertaken refurbishment of the bathrooms in our lounges. The Tuson Stand lounge has been painted and a new portrait of Shez Sinsational has been added to the Wall of Fame.

I wish to especially acknowledge the work of our CEO Carey Hobbs and all of our staff for their hard work, loyalty and dedication. It is you people that keep our Club going. Two members of that team, Trevor Smith and Paul Doherty have both recently left us. We wish you well in the future and thank you for your work.

To my fellow Board Members. Thank you for your support and hard work. We are very lucky to have the talent, knowledge and passion for Racing around our table and I look forward to our continued success in the challenging times ahead.

Lastly thank you to the members for participating in this outstanding Club.

Racing Report

Saturday August 22nd

Only seven races for the start of the season's ITM Inter-provincial Race Day. The main race was taken out by Nigel Tiley trained Spoke to Carlo who was too strong for an excellent field of winter gallopers. No local winners but a reasonable crowd and on course turnover again surpassed \$100k. The ITM room was magnificently set-up and very well patronised.

Friday September 11th

Another heavy track for this low key Friday. A double to John Wheeler with Mendip and Newstead both at good money while Time Bomb was a third local winner for Janelle Millar.

Saturday September 26th

The feature of Xtreme Raceday was obviously the return of a Grey's only race, won by I Suggest for Stratford trainer Trudy Keegan. Locals weren't going well early in the day but won the last two races Te Hana for Janelle Millar and Gypsy Fair for Allan Sharrock.

Thursday October 29th

The first race day on a goodish track (dead 4) was the Life Education Trust Tour de Taranaki and what a day for the locals winning the first seven races and running second and third in the last. Treble to John Wheeler with Altiplano, Celtic Cross and Pentathlon, a double to Allan Sharrock with You'll Do Me and Whispering the final two winners, being Airlie House for Rob Patterson and True Secret for Janelle Millar. For Pentathlon it was the start of a great patch of form culminating in a close second in the Wellington Cup.

Twilight Friday November 20th

Unfortunately weather marred the first twilight of the year but a hardy crowd enjoyed the music and racing. Three local winners shared by Peter Fleming, John Wheeler and Rosie Firkin with Ellies Empress, Heistheone and Silver Court respectively.

Thursday December 3rd

Christmas at the races again brought a very large corporate crowd for a Thursday with Pukekura Raceway spruced up in festive fashion, only local winner was Runway for John Wheeler. The strength of racing was well and truly emphasised by visiting Waikato trainers The Baker Forsman Partnership and Autridge / Richards Partnership who won two races each.

Wednesday December 23rd

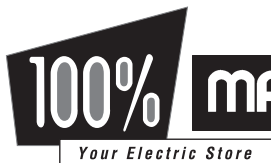
The decision to continue with a pre-christmas raceday was well and truly vindicated with a \$121k on course turnover up \$20k. While stressful for all staff, the pre-christmas raceday is proving more and more popular with patrons. Two local winners King Nero for Rob Patterson and Master Wong for John Wheeler.

Sunday December 27th

Another sunny day brought up again a very large post-christmas crowd who enjoyed some fine racing and entertainment from Ash & Aidan. Whilst we had two local winners, Sakura for Gary McBeth and Macklemore for John Wheeler, it was the win of Provocative which was most impressive after racing greenly. Provocative went on to be a big black type winner in Australia for trainer Tony Pike.

Twilight February 5th

The second of our twilight continues to struggle to reach the levels of the November meeting and it wasn't helped with the demise of Oil & Gas, due to economic conditions. The support of Paul Speirs of Speirs Wireline was still significant to help the overall success of the day. Three local winners Airlie House again for Rob Patterson, Ledbury for John Wheeler and Scoota Brown for Allan Sharrock.

Saturday February 20th

Our major premier day featuring the Platinum Homes Taranaki Cup, whilst a super day on course still struggles with horse numbers due to the clash with the Avondale Cup and Derby Trial (Avondale Guineas).

The Cup was won by Girl of My Dreams trained by Nigel Tiley and part-owned by Andrew Grierson who is a sponsor of the Harness Day via Woodlands Stud. The Group Three Phoenix Park 2 year old was won in convincing style by Caorunn for Trent Busuttin and Natalie Young. Another feature was the first running of the Bob Sharrock Memorial Oaks Prelude which attracted a strong field for the \$50k stake and was won in strong fashion by Sewreel for Baker/Forsman Team who are great supporters of racing at Pukekura Raceway. The only local winner in a very strong form raceday was Janelle Millar's Tequila Sunrise.

Thursday March 24th

Extremely low key raceday and crowd but locals again to the fore by winning the first four races Call Doubt for Glennys Hayward at 54-1 (long odds), Miss Percynallity and Battle Kat for Janelle Millar and Thin Cut the first winner for Debbie Ranger.

Harness April 1st-3rd

Another successful two day harness meeting with some excellent racing. The Auckland visitor Prince of Pops was confidently driven by Scott Phelan to comfortably win the Revital Fertilisers Taranaki Cup while in the other feature the Woodlands Stud Taranaki Breeders Stakes, the Geoff Small trained Ladytoro got up in the deciding stride to pip Blenheim visitor Lucia Bromac. Next season the club will run 2 one day meetings; the January 5th twilight in particular should be popular.

Saturday May 14th

On a slow 7 track, but with great fields the day met and exceeded all turnover budgets with a great corporate crowd as well. Turncoat a promising Allan Sharrock horse won the first very impressively to start local punters off on the right foot but the only other winner was the Janelle Millar trained Miss Percynallity who again showed a liking for her local track.

Thursday June 9th

A great crowd for mid-week meeting to celebrate the efforts of past Chairman John Gray who was soon to move to Te Puke for business. Johnny the Grocer epitomised raceday enjoyment and a big crew of family and friends turned up to farewell him in fine fashion. Locals won the first two, No Deal for John Wheeler and the Taranaki Racing No.1 syndicate, and followed by Mendip again for John Wheeler. The Gary McBeth trained Katie McKeen won the last and the locals filled all three placings. The trifecta was a fitting farewell to Johnny the Grocer but apparently festivities didn't stop there, and carried on until late at night. Go Johnny!

Saturday July 18th

Our second premier raceday was held on an extremely heavy track with at times appalling weather and visibility, but the day went on and reached all budgeted figures. Thanks to a super corporate day and 39 teams in the Speights Punting Competition. Locals won four of the eight races, a great day's result with a double to Allan Sharrock with the classy Ladies First and Art Deco whilst the other two wins were Katie McKeen for Gary McBeth and New York Minute (By 12 lengths) for Ilone Kelly and owner Bernard Kelly (ex-committee man, ex-chair of NZTR). The feature race was won in outstanding style by Longchamps for Opaki visitor Andrew Campbell giving young Tim Johnson (an apprentice) his first black type victory. The day however belonged to top jockey Lisa Allpress who won five of the eight races to extend her lead in the premiership.

Winners Trained On The Track

Exactly the same number of winners trained at Pukekura Raceway this season as last, 103. Again Allan Sharrock was the leading trainer with 36 win (up 7 on last season). John Wheeler 30, again runner up (up 9 on last season).



Statement of Accounting Policies For the Year Ended 31 July 2016

1 Statement of compliance and basis of preparation

The summary financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 43: Summary Financial Statements. These summary financial statements comply with Generally Accepted Accounting Practice in New Zealand (NZ GAAP) as it relates to summary statements. The full financial statements comply with Public Benefit Entity Standards Reduced Disclosure Regime (PBE Standards RDR) as appropriate for Tier 2 Racing not-for-profit entities.

The financial statements are presented in New Zealand dollars and all values are rounded to the nearest dollar.
The financial statements are prepared on the historical cost basis.

2 Summary financial statements

The full financial statements, which were authorised for issue on 8 November 2016, have been subject to audit by Silks Audit Chartered Accountants and an unmodified audit report was issued dated 8 November 2016. The summary financial report has been examined by the auditor for consistency with the full financial report.

The summary financial statements cannot be expected to provide as complete an understanding as that provided by the full financial statements.

The full financial statements can be obtained from the office of Taranaki Thoroughbred Racing (Inc) at Pukekura Raceway New Plymouth on request.

This is the first set of Annual financial statements prepared in accordance with the PBE standards. The Club has previously reported in accordance with Old GAAP.

REPORT OF THE INDEPENDENT AUDITOR ON THE SUMMARISED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

To the Committee of Taranaki Thoroughbred Racing Incorporated

The accompanying summarised financial statements on pages 1 to 5, which comprise the summarised statement of financial position as at 31 July 2016, the summarised statement of comprehensive revenue and expenses, summarised statement of changes in equity and cash flow statement for the year ended, and related notes, are derived from the audited financial statements of Taranaki Thoroughbred Racing Incorporated for the year ended 31 July 2016. We expressed an unmodified audit opinion on those financial statements in our report dated the 8 November 2016. Those financial statements, and the summarised financial statements, do not reflect the effects of events that occurred subsequent to the date of our report on those financial statements.

The summarised financial statements do not contain all the disclosures required for full financial statements under Tier 2 Not-For-Profit PBE Accounting Standards Reduced Disclosure Regime. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on the summarised financial statements based on our procedures, which were conducted in accordance with International Standard on Auditing (New Zealand) (ISA (NZ)) 810, "engagements to report on Summary Financial Statements".

Other than in our capacity as auditors we have no relationship with, or interests in, the incorporation.

In our opinion, the summarised financial statements derived from the audited financial statements of Taranaki Thoroughbred Racing Incorporated for the year ended 31 July 2016 are consistent, in all material respects, with those financial statements, in accordance with FRS-43.

This report is made solely to the committee, as a body, in accordance with section 26(1) of the Racing Act 2003. Our audit work has been undertaken so that we might state to the committee those matters we are required to state to them in an auditor's report and for no other purpose. To the fullest extent permitted by law, we do not accept or assume responsibility to anyone other than the committee as a body, for our audit work, for this report, or for the opinions we have formed.
